### **Preparing for Someone New**

When one says, "I belong to Paul," and another, "I belong to Apollos," are you not merely human? What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each. For we are God's servants, working together; You are God's field, God's building. According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid the foundation, and someone else is building on it. Each builder must choose with care how to build on it."

- I Corinthians 3:4-10

The apostle Paul is writing to the Corinthian Church at a time when there are divisions about theology, preaching style, and leadership approach. It is a time of transition! Some are stuck on Paul's way while others prefer Apollos. Paul makes it clear that different leaders have different ways but all of them are building on the foundation laid by Christ. His admonition to church members is that they remain receptive to various gifts and open to the possibility of growth. They can do this because they depend on God and not on the human vessel through whom the message is coming.

I don't need to remind you that we are in a time of transition. It is not an easy space to live in for any of us. To serve the transition well, I am doing things that are outside my comfort zone to help expose you to alternative ways of doing things. Our worship feedback has made it clear that you do not all share the same preferences in worship. What some of you really don't like, others wish would happen every Sunday.

Some of you think there is only one way for a sermon to be preached. Some of you don't like a traditional manuscript style, describing it as the reading of an essay. Other's loved the videos as a way into the Beatitudes. Some preachers tell a lot of stories to illustrate the scripture, while others teach, drawing deeply on scholarly study, some are poets, some are prophetic while others are pastoral. Some dig into the implications for church and society while others uncover the message for personal transformation.

The Book of Order says, "The Word is also proclaimed through song in anthems and solos based on scriptural texts, in cantatas and oratorios which tell the biblical story, in psalms and canticles, and in hymns, spirituals, and spiritual songs which present the truth of the Biblical Faith. Song in worship may also express the response of the people to the Word read, sung, enacted, or proclaimed. Drama and dance, poetry and pageant, indeed, most other human art forms [including video] are also expressions through which the people of God have proclaimed and responded to the Word. "(W-2.2008)

In preparing for a new pastor, we must get used to hearing God's Word through a preacher and teacher whose style will be different from your previous pastor. I'm trying to help you with the process of stretching so you can hear your new pastor when she or he comes.

Traditional sermons are not the preferred style of all ministers in our denomination. Some prefer creative expressions taking advantage of the wide range of styles and forms, including the use of art, music, poetry, pageant, drama, video, and dance, from which proclamation and response can emerge.

We have gained some good information from your worship feedback that will be useful in the search process. Thank you and please continue to share. Please also remember, I have a specific job to do for you in preparing for change. When I do something you don't like, it is not because I don't love you, don't care about worship, sermons, or prayers; it is because I want to help you get used to hearing God and following leaders who are different. Paul and Apollos are both building on the foundation which Christ laid. Let's all work at keeping our Spirit open to the message of Christ in whatever form it comes.

# OCTOBER 6TH IS WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY

On World Communion Sunday, October 6th, Presbyterian churches across the nation will make contributions to enable peacemaking and reconciliation. Fifty percent (50%) of the offering collected will go to causes around the globe. 25% will be shared by Presbytery of the Cascades and Synod of the Pacific,

and the final 25% stays with our congregation. The Mission/Peace/Eco-Justice committee plans to use those funds to support the local refugee community. Over the past 3 years, Salem has welcomed at least 15 refugee families mostly from the war torn Middle East conflicts. Many of these are women with children who previously spent years in camps. Salem is their first home and we can help bring them peace.




